Type

This product is an unsecured debt instrument governed by English law.

Objectives

This product is designed to provide a conditional coupon on a periodic basis. It is possible for the product to be automatically redeemed early based on pre-defined conditions. If the product is not redeemed early, both the coupon and the capital redemption at maturity will be linked to the performance of the underlyings. The product provides partial capital protection at maturity only. Some of your capital will be at risk when investing in this product. The Reference Underlying is the Underlying with the lowest observed level on the relevant observation.

Coupon

Provided that the product has not redeemed early:

- On each Coupon Observation Date, if the level of the Reference Underlying is at or above the Coupon Barrier, you will receive the Coupon on the payment date.

- Otherwise, you will not receive the Coupon.

Automatic Early Redemption

On any Early Redemption Observation Date, if the level of the Reference Underlying is at or above the Early Redemption Barrier, the product will be redeemed early and you will receive 100% of the Nominal Value.

Final Redemption

On the Maturity Date, provided that the product has not been redeemed early, you will receive a final redemption amount.

- If the Final Level of the Reference Underlying is at or above the Capital Barrier, you will receive :

100% of the Nominal Value.

- Otherwise, you will receive the Final Level of the Reference Underlying multiplied by the Nominal Value, floored at 90% of the Nominal Value.

Additional Information

- The level of each Underlying corresponds to its value expressed as a percentage of its Initial Value.

- The Initial Value of each Underlying is its value observed on the Initial Observation Date.
- The Final Level is the level of the Reference Underlying observed on the Final Observation Date.

- Coupons are expressed as a percentage of the Nominal Value.

The risk indicator assumes you keep the product for 3 years.

The actual risk can vary significantly if you cash in at an early stage and you may get back less. You may not be able to sell your product easily or you may have to sell at a price that significantly impacts on how much you get back.

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you.

We have classified this product as 2 out of 7, which is a low risk class.

This rates the potential losses from future performance at a low level, and poor market conditions are very unlikely to impact our capacity to pay you. You are entitled to receive back at least 90% of your capital (where "capital" means Nominal Value and not invested amount). Any amount over this, and any additional return, depends on future market performance and is uncertain. However, this protection against future market performance will not apply if you cash in before the Maturity Date.

If we are not able to pay you what is owed, you could lose your entire investment.

WHAT ARE THE COSTS?

HOW LONG SHOULD I HOLD IT AND CAN I TAKE MONEY OUT EARLY?

Recommended Holding Period: 3 years, which corresponds to the product maturity.

Under normal market conditions, Société Générale or an entity of its group ensures a daily secondary market during the life of the product by providing bid and offer prices expressed as percentages of the nominal value and the difference between the bid and offer prices (the spread) will not be more than 1% of such nominal value. If you want to sell the product before the Maturity Date, the price of the product will depend on market parameters at the time you wish to sell and you may sustain a partial or total capital loss. In unusual market condition, the resale of the product may be temporarily or permanently suspended.
